A QSART protocol has been found to have a specificity of 96% (Chemlinsky et al; Value of Autonomic Testing in Reflex Sympathetic Dystrophy; Mayo Clinic Proceedings Vol. 70 Pg. 1029, Nov, 1995).

Key Points

Summary Referral Information

- The Quantitative Sudomotor Axon Reflex Test (QSART) (Mayo Clinic Protocol) is currently performed in Colorado only at Colorado Rehabilitation and Occupational Medicine, LLC.
- Doctor Bernton and Doctor Schakaraschwili have attended additional post-graduate seminar training in autonomic nervous system assessment at the Mayo Clinic in Rochester and have further training on the testing equipment itself.
- Two appointments are required. The first is an initial consultation 7 or more days before the test to review medical records, perform a clinical evaluation and (if necessary) change medications in consultation with the treating physician. The second appointment is for the Laboratory Autonomic Evaluation.



- The initial consult can be performed by either Dr. Bernton or Dr. Schakaraschwili at the CROM-Aurora office.
- All laboratory evaluations are performed at the CROM Sympathetic Assessment Laboratory at the CROM-Aurora Office.
- No medications affecting sweating or skin temperature may be taken for at least a week prior to the test. No hot or cold drinks may be taken for one hour before the test.
- Laboratory testing includes the Reflex Dystrophy Computerized Evaluation, which consists of Quantitative Thermographic Gradient Assessment, Resting Sweat Output Assessment, Quantitative Stimulated Sudomotor Assessment, Computerized Analysis, and Physician Report.
- Please obtain authorization for the initial consultation.
- CROM will perform all necessary preauthorization for the testing itself after the referral is received.

Benefits and Goals of the QSART Test and Consultation

- The goal of the evaluation and associated physician consultation is to determine whether or not the patient has reflex sympathetic dystrophy (Complex Regional Pain Syndrome) based upon the best currently available objective scientific criteria, and integration of laboratory results with clinical findings. Specific clinical recommendations will be provided to the referring physician, if requested.
- The physician will review the patient's current medications, and if necessary make appropriate changes in the medication regimen (in consultation with the patient's treating physician) to ensure that medications do not interfere with the QSART evaluation. Some medications such as tricyclics require a long period of time before the sweating and temperature functions return to normal, thus the initial consultation is scheduled at least 7 days prior to the QSART test.
- The test is non-invasive and does not require sedation. This represents a substantial advance over the risks inherent in sympathetic blockade, and the associated sedation which requires at least 24 hours before the patient can return to full activity.
- The advantage of QSART includes diagnostics at approximately half the cost of alternative methods, increased specificity, decreased risk to the patient, and the provision of an objective computerized evaluation based upon extensive peer reviewed research rather than the previous diagnostic approach (trial of sympathetic blockade) which relies heavily on the patient's subjective assessment of the effectiveness of the sympathetic block.



Work Up, Narrative Reports, Costs

- The physician specialist can complete any necessary work up prior to the evaluation. For example, most patients with limb pain will require an EMG/NCV study if not previously performed. This is necessary to evaluate for nerve entrapment (which can differentiate CRPS Type I from CRPS Type II and affect treatment recommendations), to rule out neuropathy (which can affect the sweat test results and the temperature evaluation) and to evaluate for alternative treatable causes of the patient's symptoms. If an EMG/NCV has not been performed and is required, this can generally be performed during the initial consultation.
- After the evaluation, a clinical narrative report is prepared in which the results of the clinical evaluation and medical record review are integrated with the Reflex Dystrophy Computerized Autonomic Evaluation. This report also gives a final assessment of whether the patient has reflex sympathetic dystrophy. Also, if the patient does have reflex dystrophy, specifics of the evaluation result predict the patient's likelihood of response to specific therapies (e.g. sympathetic blockade). The clinical narrative report also formulates specific treatment recommendations, if requested.
- The Reflex Dystrophy Autonomic Evaluation cost is less than the cost of diagnosis by a trial of therapeutic sympathetic block and a bone scan.
- If an EMG/NCV is indicated, this will be discussed with the referring clinician.


